


- Add the numbers on the number plate find the biggest total
- Find the difference between the biggest number you can make using all of the digits and the smallest
- Pick two number plates and use the digits to make as many different numbers as you can—put them in ascending or descending order
- If A = 1 B = 2 Z = 26 etc and numbers are their value which number plate is worth the most—can you find a number plate that equals exactly 100 or a multiple of 10 etc

Memory and Concentration Game Ideas Don't

Clapping patterns—repeat back

I went to the shops and I bought...

(start alphabetically)

Pairs—using playing cards or any cards that can be matched—you could make your own with number facts or times tables to work only

The tray game

Simon says... quick thinking

Treasure cups—arrange come cups upside down and hide objects under each one (buttons, coins, rubbers, chocolates!!) Take it in turns to uncover a cup if the amount and type of treasure match you get to keep them in your pile. You could change it to find number bonds to 10 for younger children

The coin game—have a pile of coins, a piece of card and a stop watch. Create a sequence using some coins e.g. three 2ps and two 50ps. Let them look for a set time then cover it over. The child then has to recreate the pattern. They can try and beat their times, add more coins, use a wider range of coins etc
