In year 5 at Potten End C of E Primary School we have been doing a Europe project in our Geography work. We are having soooooo much fun doing it.

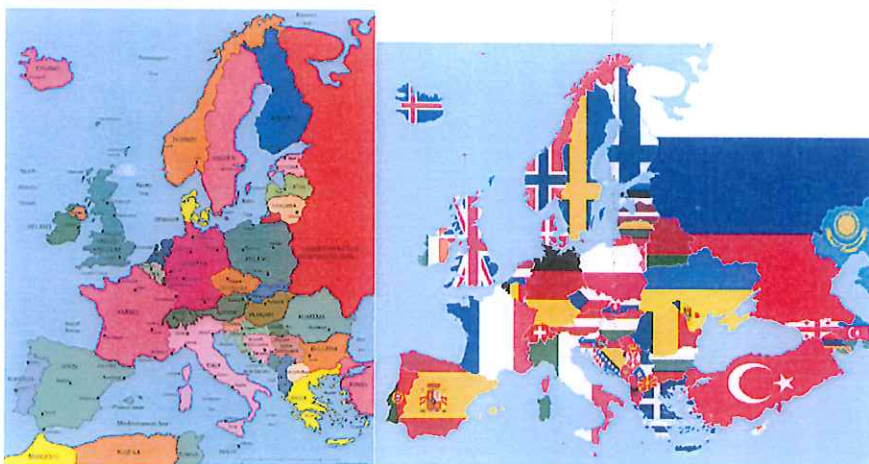
We had to pick 10 things to do off of a sheet and do them in our lessons, in our spare time and at home.
