Dear Parents and carers

This academic year seems to have really flown by, or is it just us? It's been a while since we last put out a newsletter but for us as for many of you, life has rather gotten in the way for us! We wanted to take a moment to share some of the highlights we have been privileged to witness over the last school year here at Potten End.

It really has been the most action-packed year here at Potten End and we know you will have felt this too — our children have been given so many enrichment opportunities on top of the quality teaching inside the classrooms — with our programme of visits and trips as well as lots of exciting visitors coming into school

Our Friends of School have been a busy band of passionate and committed individuals as well, bringing a wide variety of fundraising and social events for the whole school community to participate in. These have ranged from the very popular Christmas Fayre, Movie Night, Hairbraiding event, School Disco, ice cream sale as well as last week's Quiz Night in The Plough!

This energy has seen a really positive enhancement to the sense of community within the school as well as raising much needed funds to cover the costs of replacing our Trim Trail in the playground as well as the visiting Pantomime at Christmas. We are so incredibly grateful to our 4 Co-Chairs as well as their wonderful team of class volunteers who go above and beyond to make such special memories for our children.

New lunchtime provision

One of the real privileges of being a Governor is the opportunity to come into school and observe and learn from our children. We get to see them during the calm of lessons during learning walks where we see them all focused, supported and happy to share their learning and books with us, however recently, whilst spending time with Mrs Ridgway, to observe SEN practice, I was also privileged to understand and observe our new lunchtime play provision.

Mrs Sharpling and Mrs Kennedy had been to visit a number of other local schools and had seen "free play" in practice. The opportunity to open up all areas of our grounds to our children and giving them a broader variety of inclusive activities to be available to them was a fairly new idea — I can honestly say I was blown away by the **sheer unbounded joy and energy** I witnessed in every part of the school grounds — children can explore Wonder Wood, climb trees, play with the Mud Kitchens, dig in the mud with diggers, dance to music, use the climbing frame and trim trail, dash about on ride on carts and scooters, shoot basketball hoops and hula hoop to name just a few activities. Every child at lunchtime was happy and engaged — moving freely between groups and activities.

This inclusive approach to lunchtime play has truly transformed the atmosphere into a happy and joyful space for all to flourish.

SIAMS Inspection/SEA visits

As you will all no doubt remember we had our SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodists Schools) inspection at the end of January, SIAMS Inspection is the Diocese's version of Ofsted but focussed on how well we represent and support the development of our distinctive Christian vision as a school. We were delighted to be involved with this inspection alongside the staff as both Governors and for Claire Wallis and Emma Harris as representatives of the Church and Local Community. You will have already seen the results that inspection found us to "be living up to our foundations as a Church school and is enabling pupils and adults to flourish" which is the best possible result we could have had – the staff, children and parents that also met with the inspector did us so proud! We also recognise the incredible efforts of both Mrs Kennedy and the SLT (Miss Ford, Mrs Sharpling, Mrs Hall & Mrs Ridgway) to develop and strengthen this ethos throughout the school.

We continue to welcome our SEA (School Effectiveness Advisor) who supports our ongoing monitoring and assessment of various elements of our curriculum to ensure we continue to deliver on our ambition of "Quality First Teaching" – Our SEA has done "deep dive" assessments of Reading provision as well as RE, Maths, Art and D&T curriculums – we have been able to be a part of these both as observers but also to be given feedback and we are delighted that all subjects and areas have been assessed as "Good" and all showing solid and continuing strengthening.

Staff Goodbyes

Michelle Gasper (TA) has been a part of this wonderful school for 20 years and has now decided the time has come for her to retire to be able to spend more time with her own grandchildren. Mrs Gasper has been such a fundamental part of this school, always smiling, always with a kind word and a sunny disposition and this energy and enthusiasm to support each and every child in her classes over the years will be hugely missed but we wish her all the very best for the next adventure.

Sophie Craddock (Year 2 teacher) — is also leaving to take up a new post in a school closer to her home. Miss Craddock joined us as a NQT (newly qualified teacher) 6 years ago. She has been heavily involved in the implementation of our Read Write Inc scheme. This move represents a huge opportunity for her to spread her wings and experience teaching outside Potten End — we wish her every success in her new role.

Laura Lopez – having only recently joined us as a SEN TA, clearly the children have had a fundamental influence on her and she has decided her future is absolutely in teaching and will start her teacher training in September – whilst at the school she has already made her mark and has built a strong relationship with those children she works with, as well as supporting our After School Club. We wish her all the luck for her training and hope to see her back at the school very soon as part of her work experience!
