# Matters arising from previous meetings

- 1. All feedback arising from the last forum, shared with the teaching and support staff

- 4. The forum put forward the reoccurring themes raised to the forum at the end of each school year
  - a. The **number of PE days will remain the same**, so parents can purchase the right ratio of PE kit to uniform. The school aim to communicate the specific days before the end of term
  - b. Where possible, the office are aiming to send out advance notice of as many clubs available for the new school year
  - c. The school will communicate before the end of term regarding the expected costs for the year ahead for trips etc, however for residentials this will be an estimated cost until the venues confirm which is usually September onwards. The school are also reviewing the trips provided to ensure that there is not duplication (eg. 2 history trips) and focus on other curriculum areas as well.
  - d. The **afterschool provision** will continue from September, and will continue to be Monday to Thursday, as there is not sufficient demand for a Friday.

## 2. Feedback & questions for the teachers & support team

Summary of Discussion

Thanks to all involved for the amazing **PGL trip** (Y6) The children came back buzzing (and exhausted). So many happy memories made, and challenges overcome during the activities. Brilliant PE staff keeping the class safe & happy. Plenty of teacher tweets were sent to calm anxious parents.

**Bikeability (Y6)** Sadly not a good first day, but action taken immediately by the SLT once feedback was received from parents, and the sessions restarted on the Wednesday. Children seemed to enjoy it.

## After school clubs :

- Parents are pleased with the variety of activities on offer but disappointed at the lack of KS1 clubs. All new activities are accessible only for older children. Mrs Kennedy is aware of the lack of clubs for KS1 and the School are actively looking to expand clubs on offer for KS1., however it comes from providers limitations and their own students age requirements due to skills needed. Magic Maths has decided not to carry on in PE school from September.
- Parents are wondering if Football Club on a Thursday could be converted to multi sports or Basketball include Year 2. Football club has been converted from multi sports as historically requested by students/parents and it is very popular, therefore changing it will be a loss for those attending. Games On is unable to provide another date/club for multi spots session as they only have one slot available on a Thursday for PE.
- Parents with children going into Y5&6 are wondering if the netball club which started this
  year and played in tournaments, will continue given the parent volunteer will no longer be
  available when her daughter leaves year 6. Mrs Kennedy confirmed that they hope to run
  this again and asked the reps to gauge interest.

**Sports day** was brilliant, and so glad the weather enabled this to take place. The parents races were brilliant, and wondered if the teachers could also take part as happened in previous years. Parents wondered if

- Really loved the competitive nature of the long distance / sprint race, however, would it be
  possible to have separate long distance/sprint races for the boys and girls in the future to
  make things a bit fairer. Mrs Kennedy confirmed that those were judged separately for the
  fastest boy and girl, even though racing at the same time.
- The first half could be structured to be less chaotic for parents to watch

**Lunch box rack** – a parent had observed that the outside rack the kids put their lunch boxes was dirty with discarded food, and requested they get wiped down more regularly. A thorough clean happens at the end of each half term, however Mrs Kennedy will request that they are checked for any obvious debris weekly.

Is it possible for the school to buy **hi-vis vests** with our school's name for the kids and teachers/volunteers who goes on school trips to make it easier to identify our kids in the crowd? Mrs Kennedy agreed to purchase hi-vis vests for students/staff to be used during off-site school trips.

I also have been asked by a parent if the school is planning to continue with the **reading mornings** and if volunteers are needed in the mornings to do readings with the kids? The school used to ask parents if they can stay in the mornings to read with the kids from different classes, but I haven't seen this in a while. Reading mornings are ongoing and school is very fortunate to have many committed parents who attend weekly for those sessions. At present there is no requirement for volunteers. Mrs Kennedy points out that any interested parents can always call/email office at any time. Although coming on site during school hours and helping with curricular activities involves prior DBS checks. Therefore, long term commitments from parents are preferred, due to costing and time involved.

### **Actions**

- 1. Mrs Kennedy to share the feedback with the SLT, teaching and support teams.
- 2. Y4 & Y5 Reps to gauge the interest in the netball club which the school hope to continue for the new Y5 & Y6 class.
- 3. The school will purchase hi-vis vests for students/staff to be used during off-site school trips.
- 4. Parents to contact the office to provide their availability for volunteering opportunities.

#### 3. School meals options/choices

Summary of Discussion

Positive feedback regarding **school meals** choices. Flexibility of choosing each day is very welcomed by parents, however the quality of the meals has received a lot of feedback.

Lots of complaints / feedback regarding school dinners:

- Feedback from children particularly further up the school is that portions are too small
- Jacket potatoes are small, hard and dry
- The chicken pie which used to be lovely has changed and is now horrible (several children commented on this)
- Pasta isn't always available on a Wednesday, so where a child doesn't like potatoes (roast or jacket), they may go hungry when pasta isn't on offer.

" I'd like to raise the salad bar again which may make me sound like a broken record but following the last parent forum they reintroduced it which was brilliant.

However, since the menu change there is now one bowl of mixed salad including lettuces and tomatoes. This is just not as appealing to children, as the individual pots were, as lots of children don't like all things and therefore a mix is overwhelming for them as well as allergies for certain foods. I would be interested to understand the rationale around the change and to express my disappointment. "

#### **Actions**

1. Mrs Kennedy will discuss the salad bar option and the portion sizes and check the availability of pasta/potatoes with the new kitchen staff.

### 4. Idea: curriculum meeting & following years updates

Summary of Discussion

Summary of Discussion
