	parental workshop for parents has been held to try to address parental anxieties.		
	Additional workshops are to be offered to parents. Parents have fed back that they		
	appreciated the ability to be able to discuss anxieties. PPG funding is supporting this		
	initiative.		
•	The school vision and values were re-visited during inset day.		
•	Trips include History and Sport.

Q: How good is Reception attendance? Excellent – 100%.		
Q: Is parental home-working impacting absence? Not notably. There is a core group of		
persistent absentees and the school is working daily with those families.		
Q: Where there is a meeting with the head for attendance under 90% - is this with parents?		
Yes.		
Q: Art & DT are a focus area – how will you measure progress? HiP visits will be used to		
support - improvement is expected a the next visit in November.
