The United Kingdom (UK)


Continent Europe

- A long distance from the equator.
- Shops and markets sell fruit and vegetables which are from all around the world.
- The UK has four different seasons: Autumn, Winter, Spring, Summer. The weather during each season can be very different.

Ecuador

Continent South America
Capital City Quito
Language Spanish

- Quito is in the highlands of Ecuador surrounded by Volcanoes. It is the highest capital city above sea level in the world.
- Very near the equator.
- Shops and markets sell fruit and vegetables which have been grown locally.
- Ecuador has two different seasons: Summer and Winter.
 The Summer is very dry and the winter is very wet.




Equator

The equator is an imaginary line that divides the Earth in half. The weather on the equator is hot all year round.

Equator	An imaginary circle around the middle of the Earth.
Atlas	A book of maps.
Physical Feature	Something which happens naturally, without humans helping.
Human Feature	Something which humans have purposely made.




